As one of the largest Mohalla in AIUT, if not the largest, the Adam Mohalla Team has to follow up on the most number of children during admission time. Work has been going on in full swing in Adam Mohalla so that children get admitted to Standard Schools and Montessoris.

A total of 44 children have been admitted in standard schools and 7 in standard montessoris. A school-wise breakdown of these children is as follows;

Majority of the children not going to school are all those who will be 2.5 years or thereabouts in August 2012. They will either be admitted in schools later in the year or next year.

For the purpose of following up on children who go to Montessori only schools, we keep them in the sub-standard category. The objective is to monitor them till they become 5.5 years of age and make sure that they select a standard school that goes upto Matric. 9 of the 27 are studying in Standard Montessoris including a few who were admitted last year. A few are in higher classes and refuse to be convinced to move to a better school. Our immediate and most important task is to convince those parents whose children, under the 5.5 age group, have been admitted to sub-standard schools.

Our thanks to the Mohalla Education Team for the effort put in by them to ensure that children get admitted to good schools. It is a difficult task, following up on more than 50 parents, but one they have performed admirably.
